Search and Destroy

We Representing Madan Bhandari Academy of Health Sciences, students of the second semester along with the Department of Public Health and Community Medicine went on a community field visit to search and destroy the program. We visited the rural municipalities of Bakaiya, Manahari, and Bagmati.

We tried to make people aware of this vectorborne disease, its transmission, and its effect on health. The objective of the Search and Destroy program was to control the endemic of Dengue and Japanese Encephalitis. The field visit was organized for 4 days. A school health program was also organized to educate schoollevel students. We searched the surrounding areas by dividing students into various groups. Many favorable places for larva development were discovered and they were destroyed. We also conducted short questionnaires with local people about dengue. Assoc. Prof. Roshan Kumar Roy, Mr. Supendra Karki, and Mr. Ashwin Karakheti were moderators for this community field visit.

Health Camp

Department of Public Health and Community Medicine of Madan Bhandari Academy of Health Sciences in association with MBAHS Hetauda hospital, had undertaken a major initiative of organizing free health check-up camp with the noble purpose of creating awareness among the masses for preventive healthcare, being the need of the hour. The health camp was organized in five different places which included Khairahani ,Chitwan, Rai Gaun, Raksirang, Bakaiya rural municipality and Kailash rural municipality with vulnerable group members who had difficulties in accessing health care services. The free heath check-up camp embraced general check-up, gynecology check-up, orthopedic check-up, eye, ear, nose and throat check-up. Learning by Doing

The "Health for All" movement was a part of the Alma-Ata Declaration on Primary Health Care (PHC) in 1978 A.D. According to Alma-Ata declaration PHC is essential health care based on practical, scientifically sound and socially acceptable methods and technology made universally accessible to individuals and families in the community through their full participation, at a cost that community and country can afford.

The 1st batch students of the Public Health Department are currently involved in gaining practical knowledge of Primary Health Care in Nepal after obtaining theoretical Knowledge in the first semester. Among the three tiers of the government we have visited the local government in Makawanpur district.

On our first field visit we went to Hetauda Municipality with the guidance of our respective faculties with the aim of learning about structures, organogram, functions, role of health sector and to observe the work done to meet the elements of PHC. We went to different sections present in the municipality among which our focus was on the Health, Ayurveda and Social Welfare sections. We gained a brief knowledge about the population, health care units, health workers, health budget and environmental budget, access of health, various activities conducted till date and plans for further programme. On the second day we learned about the formation of the judiciary committee of Hetauda, policy making and coordination with other bodies.

On the third day of our field visit, we visited the Urban Health Promotion Center (UHPC) located on Hetauda sub-metropolitan Ward-17. We learned about roles and functions conducted by UHPC to meet the vision set by PHC. Preventive, promotive, curative services were provided by UHPC to the local population. We also learned about the recording and reporting system of UHPC. The management of free essential medicine, disaster management and intersectoral co-ordinations were interesting topics covered in the visit.

On the fourth day we gained knowledge about services provided by Health Post to general populations which includes immunization, safe motherhood, out patient department services, nutritional package for new mothers who have just given a birth to a baby. We were also able to learn about conditions and programme being conducted for controlling and preventing communicable disease, non-communicable disease and vector-borne diseases.

FIFA World Cup 2022: The Winter World Cup
